DEVON BANK SUPPORTS AFGHAN REFUGEES WITH DEBIT CARD MATCHING PROGRAM

CHICAGO, IL – Can spare change change lives? That's the idea behind the Sanctuary Debit Card from Chicago-based Devon Bank. It operates like a typical rounding card, which means it rounds up to the nearest whole dollar on every transaction. But unlike other rounding cards, it will automatically direct the difference to a charity that supports Afghan refugees, a cause that's become particularly urgent due to the dire situation in their home country.

Additionally, for the remainder of 2021 and through the end of 2022, Devon Bank will make contributions to the same charity with a 100% match of every Sanctuary Cardholder's rounded funds. "We're a community bank," said bank president Thomas Olivieri, "And we take our commitment to serving the whole community, including refugees, very seriously."

Based in the West Rogers Park neighborhood of the city, Devon Bank serves one of the most diverse communities in Chicago.
